

- The Ark as a testimony bore the 'covenant stipulations' and 'reminders'.
- The Mercy Seat functions as the lid for the Ark, thus concealing its contents from view.
- The Ark serves as a testimony against Israel's rebellion and sinfulness.
- The Mercy Seat concealed the Lord's view from the ever-condemning judgment of the Law.
- Each of the three items placed in the Ark are connected with rebellion on the part of Israel. Thus, reminders.
  - Ten Commandments: Reminds Israel of their golden calf rebellion (Ex.32).
  - Aaron's Rod that Budded: Reminds Israel of Korah who defied Moses (Nu.16-17).
  - Pot of Manna: Reminds Israel despite God providing for them they murmured (*Ex.16*).
- The Mercy Seat ties together the OT and NT concepts of covering for sin.
- Christ's sacrifice is sufficient to satisfy ("propitiation") God's justice (Ro.3:25; He.2:17; 9:5; 1Jn.2:2; 4:10).
