SIMILARITIES BETWEEN COLOSSIANS AND HEBREWS

Colossians and Hebrews compare and contrast Christ the Lord in creation and redemption. In Colossians Paul argues the *supremacy* of Christ in the context of Gnosticism. The author of the book of Hebrews argues the *superiority* of the Son in the context of Judaism. Colossians dealt with the heresy of Jewish-Gnosticism and/or Jewish asceticism. Hebrews explains how Christ is superior to the whole Old Covenant. We must be on the guard to not diminish the centrality of Christ as Lord and Savior.

Colossians 1 The Supremacy of the Son



Hebrews 1 The Superiority of the Son

The Son is the image of the invisible God (v.15)

"Who is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of every creature" (Cl.1:15)

The Son is the exact representation of God's being (v.3)

"Who being the brightness of his glory, and the express image of his person..." (**Hb.1:3**)

In the beginning, all things were created by the Son (v.16)

"For by him were all things created, that are in heaven, and that are in earth, visible and invisible, whether they be thrones, or dominions, or principalities, or powers: all things were created by him, and for him" (Cl.1:16)

In the beginning, God made the universe through His Son (v.2)

"Hath in these last days spoken unto us by his Son, whom he hath appointed heir of all things, by whom also he made the worlds;" (Hb.1:2)

In the present, all things hold together in the Son (v.17)

"And he is before all things, and by him all things consist" **(Cl.1:17)**

In the present, the Son sustains all things by His powerful word (v.3)

"...and upholding all things by the word of his power..." (Hb.1:3)

The Son is before all things; He is the head of the body, the church (v.17-18)

"And he is the head of the body, the church..." (Cl.1:18)

The Son is seated at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven (v.3)

"sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on high..." (Hb.1:3)

God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in the Son (v.19)

"For it pleased the Father that in him should all fulness dwell..." (Cl.1:19)

The Son is the radiance of God's glory (v.3)

"Who being the brightness of his glory..." (Hb.1:3)

God made peace through the blood of the Son, shed on the cross (v.20)

"And, having made peace through the blood of his cross..." (Cl.1:20)

The Son provided purification for sins (v.3)

"when he had by himself purged our sins,..." (Hb.1:3)

In the end, God through the Son will reconcile to Himself all things (v.20)

"by him to reconcile all things unto himself..." (Cl.1:20)

In the end, the Son will become heir of all things (v.2)

"whom he hath appointed heir of all things..." (Hb.1:2)
