## **EXPOSITION AND WARNING IN HEBREWS**

The themes of the book of Hebrews provide practical application throughout. The readers are told that there is no turning back or continuation of the old Jewish system. The arguments are made that the unique priesthood of Christ superseded the old covenant. God's people must only look to Christ which includes His atoning death, glorious resurrection, and ascension which opened the way to the true sanctuary of God's presence. The warnings to "ignore so great a salvation" (2:3) or to give up the pursuit of holiness (12:10,14) is to face the anger of the "Living God" (10:31). In the midst of these eight expositions are five warning passages that remind the readers of the divine judgment that came upon the rebellious Exodus generation in the desert. Two of the expositions actually include the actual warning.
