## NEW LOVE FOR LIFE — 1 JOHN 2:7-11

## LOVE AS AN OLD COMMANDMENT (2:7)

- Brethren, I write no new commandment to you, but an <u>old commandment</u> which you have had from the beginning. The old commandment is the word which you heard from the beginning (1Jn.2:7)
  - John is not writing something they never heard before.
  - This command to love has been around since the beginning with Israel (Du.6:5-6; Lv.19:18)
  - We are commanded to love the Lord our God (Du.6:5-6)
  - We are commanded to love our neighbor as ourselves (Lv.19:18)

## LOVE AS A <u>NEW COMMANDMENT</u> (2:8)

- Again, a <u>new commandment</u> I write to you, which thing is true <u>in Him</u> and <u>in you</u>, because the darkness is passing away, and the true light is already shining (1Jn.2:8)
  - I'm giving you something new (fresh). It is not new in time but in quality.
  - The newness of it is true "in Him." There is a level of love never able to be understood until it was personified in Jesus Christ.
  - We never can find that perfect love toward others until we see it in Jesus.
  - That newness which was first manifested by Christ, can now be manifest through us by the Holy Spirit.
  - There is a freshness to this love because it's now manifest "in you." The "new commandment" is that we love one another.
  - Whatever the relationship of the Holy Spirit to believers in the past was, it was a "with" and whatever it is to us, it's an "in."
  - When the Holy Spirit comes "in you," you'll be all wrapped up in loving one another.
  - Because Messiah came and inaugurated that age, and is delivering us out of this present evil age, we are given this new capacity to love.

## LOVE AS A WAY OF LIFE (2:9-11)

- <sup>3</sup> <sup>9</sup>He who says he is in the light, and hates his brother, is in darkness until now. <sup>10</sup>He who loves his brother abides in the light, and there is no cause for stumbling in him. <sup>11</sup>But he who hates his brother is in darkness and walks in darkness, and does not know where he is going, because the darkness has blinded his eyes. (1Jn.2:9-11)
  - If you hate, you're not in this kingdom.
  - Love is not going to be perfect in your life, but it will be the direction of it.
  - If no change has happened, then there has been no work of God in the heart.
  - There is a new commandment to love, added to an old commandment to love, and then he talks about the life of love.
