JOHN'S EPISTLES COMPARED

FIRST JOHN

Is written to believers in general (the church)

Speaking to all believers

Calls the church to be loyal to the truth and love

Sound doctrine and love are what define a true believer

No personal reference

Truth and love are the tests to prove the validity of ones faith

SECOND JOHN

Is written to a family (Elect lady and family)

Narrows it down to a family

Calls for families to be loyal to the truth and love

Truth and love are always related (Hospitality is not for those who are deviant to the truth)

Is sort of negative— who not to receive love

Sound doctrine is the essential for showing love

An anonymous personal reference to the Elect lady and her children, plus her sister and her children

The elect lady has allowed a false teacher into her home. Her act of love was outside of the truth.

THIRD JOHN

Is written to an individual (Gaius)

Narrows it down to an individual

Calls for individuals to be loyal to the truth and love

Truth and love are always related (Hospitality is open to all who are in the truth)

Is sort of positive— who to receive love

Where someone is sound in truth, love is to be shown and not withheld

Personal

Gaius is a good example of truth and love. Diotrephes refuses hospitality.

- The theme in all three epistles is the same, namely, truth (doctrine) and love (moral).
- Together (2-3 John) we get insight into how to deal with those who say they represent Christ.
