



REVELATION — CHRONOLOGICAL CHAPTERS



Then I stood on the sand of the sea. And I saw a beast rising up out of the sea, having seven heads and ten horns, and on his horns ten crowns, and on his heads a blasphemous name.



"a beast rising out of the sea" (Rv.13:1)



"a beast"

This beast (individual) appears to be familiar to the readers. He seems to be mentioned in passing.



"When they finish their testimony, the beast that ascends out of the bottomless pit will make war against them, overcome them, and kill them" (**Rv.11:7**).

- The beast is formally introduced in Revelation 13.
- It is assumed the readers at least understand his role Rv.11. In both Rv.11 and Rv.13 his name is not known.

"having seven heads and ten horns, and on his horns ten crowns" (Rv.13:1)



"seven heads... ten horns... ten crowns"

- In Revelation 12 it opens with the composite dragon as here (Rv.13) with the composite beast.
- The composite beast is a personification of the final beast (Antichrist) as was the composite dragon of Satan.

"on his heads a blasphemous name" (Rv.13:1)



"blasphemous name"

- The blasphemous name is a new characteristic for the composite beast.
- The blasphemous names are not provided.
- These names indicate that they violate the name of the one true God.
- Since the 7 empires failed to kill the male-child, the <u>blasphemous names</u> likely <u>express</u> the <u>contempt</u> they have for <u>God</u>.

COMPOSITE SYMBOLS

Revelation 12

Composite Dragon

7 heads; 10 Horns; 7 Crowns

Emphasis: The 7 kingdoms that intend to prevent the reign of the Son by killing Him



Revelation 13 Composite Beast

7 heads; 10 Horns; 10 Crowns

Emphasis: The 10 kings that arise out of the final Beast Empire

ANTI-CHRIST

Now the beast which I saw was like a leopard, his feet were like the feet of a bear, and his mouth like the mouth of a lion. The dragon gave him his power, his throne, and great authority.



"the beast... his" (Rv.13:2)



- The Greek word (tharion) is neuter in gender. So the beast is not masculine nor feminine.
- Thus, the pronouns should reflect that neuter gender. This changes at verse 8.
- This composite beast is the sum total of the previous kingdoms that are hostile to the rule of God.

"leopard... bear... lion" (Rv.13:2)



"leopard... bear... lion"



These animal-like-characteristics are not literal but symbolical.



Daniel 7:1-9 recounts a vision involving four king/kingdoms:



The LEOPARD is known for its speed.

Speed

MEDO-PERSIA



The BEAR is known for its powerful feet to kill.

Power

GREECE



The LION for its sound of terror.

Terror

ROME



An indescribable iron teeth beast

Devours



10 kings + 1 Little Horn = 11 Then - 3 = 8 Horns

"the beast" (Rv.13:2) "the beast"

- John's composite beast does not refer to Daniel's 4th kingdom with feet of iron and clay.
- Daniel's 4th beast empire with 10 horns is John's composite beast with 7 heads and 10 horns with crowns.
- Daniel emphasized the 4th beast kingdom and John emphasizes the 10 horns.
 - Daniel emphasized the original beast kingdom (Rome)
 - John emphasizes the restored beast kingdom, which is evidenced in the 10 kings

"the beast" (Rv.13:2)



- The composite beast and the beast/Antichrist are synonymous.
- What John ascribes to the composite beast is what actually happens to the beast.
- After the beast/Antichrist subdues 3 kings, he and the remaining 7, become one in purpose (Rv.17:17).

"The dragon gave him his power, his throne, and great authority" (Rv.13:2)



- The source of the composite beast's power is the dragon.
- The dragon (singular) empowers the composite beast.
- All that the composite beast is, he owes it to the dragon.



"And the devil said to Him, "All this authority I will give You, and their glory; for this has been delivered to me, and I give it to whomever I wish" (**Lk.4:6**).



And I saw one of his heads as if it had been mortally wounded, and his deadly wound was healed. And all the world marveled and followed the beast.

"one of his heads as if it had been mortally wounded" (Rv.13:3)



"mortally wounded"

- The phrase, "as if it had been mortally wounded" is the same phrase used for the Lamb (Jesus) in Revelation 5:6.
- As Jesus was truly put to death, so one of the heads of composite beast will be killed.
- The text does not tell us how the head was wounded.

"his deadly wound was healed" (Rv.13:3)



"deadly wound"

- Literally, it says, "the wound of his death was healed"
- This confirms that a <u>literal death occurred</u>.
- The possessive pronoun, "his" does not refer to the head, but to the beast.
- The beast was healed.
- The issue is the fact that the composite beast lived after death.



Revelation 13:1-3

"And I saw one of his heads as if it had been <u>mortally wounded</u>, and his <u>deadly wound</u> was

> healed. And all the world marveled and followed the beast" (Rv.13:3)

"...the beast who was wounded by the sword and lived" (Rv.13:14)

The Beast



Revelation 17:8,11

The beast that you saw <u>was</u>, and <u>is not</u>, and <u>will ascend</u> out of the <u>bottomless pit</u> and go to perdition.

...when they see the beast that was, and is not, and yet is (Rv.17:8)

The <u>beast</u> that <u>was</u>, and <u>is not</u>, is himself <u>also the</u> <u>eighth</u>, and is <u>of the seven</u>, and is going to perdition (Rv.17:11)

The Beast



Summary

Satan is kicked out of heaven down to the earth (Rv.12:7-9)

One of the heads of the 7th kingdom is mortally wounded (Rv.13:3)

The <u>head</u> that is <u>wounded</u> is the 7th and the <u>healing</u> produces the 8th (Rv.17:11)

Satan will empower the dictator to carry out his evil intents (Rv.13:2)

The Beast

"all the world marveled and followed the beast" (Rv.13:3)



"followed the beast"

- That the world follows him confirms something supernatural happened.
- The whole world is a figure of speech. It does not mean every single individual.
- The majority of the living earth-dwellers will be amazed by the composite beast's coming back to life.

DANIEL'S 70TH WEEK: FIRST HALF

The Prince (7th King) Who Becomes the Beast (8th King)

(Beast out of the Sea • 7th King Becomes 8th • Little Horn • Antichrist)



- He will grow in power like a horn grows out of the head of an animal over time (Da.7:7-8).
 - Because of the covenant, the <u>beginning of the 70th</u>
 <u>Week</u> will be characterized by 'peace' for Israel. The
 Prince will be focused on conquering Gentile nations
 politically (Da.7:7-8; Rv.6:1-2).
 - He is the 7th king that becomes the 8th king (Rv.17:10-11). As the 7th king he rules for a "short space" (Rv.17:10).

Deadly Wound Was Healed

 Assassination: Because the 8th king comes out of the bottomless pit, it suggests he is raised from the dead (Rv.17:8).

So they worshiped the dragon who gave authority to the beast; and they worshiped the beast, saying, "Who is like the beast? Who is able to make war with him?"

"So they worshiped the dragon" (Rv.13:4)



"worshiped the dragon"

- They worshiped the dragon because he gave his authority to the beast.
- The dragon gave the rule of earth to the beast and the people respond with worship to it.

"So they worshiped the dragon" (Rv.13:4)



"worshiped the dragon"



He is at least worshipped for his sovereignty.

"Who is like the beast? Who is able to make war with him?" (Rv.13:4) "Who is like the beast?"

- The <u>rhetorical question</u> suggests <u>no one is like the composite beast</u>.
- Since the composite beast is restored from the dead who would wage war with it?
- An enemy that cannot be killed cannot be defeated.
- The pronoun is neuter so the composite beast is referred to here not the beast/king (would be "he").

And he was given a mouth speaking great things and blasphemies, and he was given authority to continue for forty-two months.

"mouth speaking great things" (Rv.13:5)

"8 I was considering the horns, and there was another horn, a <u>little one</u>, coming up among them, before whom <u>three of the first horns were plucked out</u> by the roots. And there, in this horn, were eyes like the eyes of a man, and a mouth speaking pompous words. ²⁰ and the <u>ten horns</u> that were on its head, and the other horn which came up, before which three fell, namely, <u>that horn</u> which had eyes and a mouth which spoke pompous words, whose appearance was greater than his fellows." (**Da.7:8, 20**).



- In Revelation 13 the composite beast has a mouth like a lion so he can terrorize people.
- Since the dragon gave the composite beast everything, it is likely he also gave him the blasphemous language as well.

"he was given authority to continue for forty-two months" (Rv.13:5)

- The dragon gave the composite beast 42 months to perform.
- The dragon is only able to grant 42 months because that is the limit God set.
- Notice these all occur at the same time:
 - (1) The composite beast (Rv.13:5)
 - (2) The beast/king from the abyss (Rv.11:7)
 - (3) The protective work for the woman (Rv.12:6)
 - (4) The ministry of the two witnesses (Rv.11:2)

Then he opened his mouth in blasphemy against God, to blaspheme His name, His tabernacle, and those who dwell in heaven.



"he opened his mouth in blasphemy against God... His tabernacle" (Rv.13:6)



"against God... tabernacle"

- The height of the composite beast's arrogance.
- To blaspheme God's name is to break the third commandment— "You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain" (Ex.20:7)
- Speaking God's name in vain is to use it for evil purposes.
- To blaspheme God's temple is clarified by "those who dwell in heaven." Tabernacle symbolically refers to God's holy ones (angels).

It was granted to him to make war with the saints and to overcome them. And authority was given him over every tribe, tongue, and nation.

"make war with the saints and to overcome them" (Rv.13:7) "overcome them"

- There does not seem to be a general protection from the composite beast.
- He will be <u>victorious over the saints</u>.
- The saints were earlier defined as the woman's children who keep the commandments of God and hold the testimony of Jesus (Rv.12:17)
- The realm of the composite beast's <u>authority is global</u>.

All who dwell on the earth will worship him, whose names have not been written in the **Book of Life of the Lamb slain** from the foundation of the world.

"him" (Rv.13:8)



- The Greek text now uses the masculine pronoun.
- This is the first time the composite beast is referred to in the masculine.
- This seems to indicate the relationship between the kings (part of composite beast) and the final beast can be spoken of interchangeably.
- Also, the tense of the verbs go from past in time to future in time.
- The elect do not worship the beast. Thus, they will not take his Mark, making them the objects of his wrath.

⁹If anyone has an ear, let him hear. 10 He who leads into captivity shall go into captivity; he who kills with the sword must be killed with the sword. Here is the patience and the faith of the saints.

REVELATION 13:9-10

"If anyone has an ear, let him hear" (Rv.13:9)



"let him hear"



Revelation 13:9-10 is a commentary on the conduct of the saints.



This formula concluded each of the messages concerning the seven churches of Asia.



"9And He said, "Go, and tell this people: 'Keep on hearing, but <u>do not understand</u>; Keep on seeing, but <u>do not perceive</u>.' "Make the heart of this people dull, And their ears heavy, And shut their eyes; Lest they <u>see</u> with their eyes, And <u>hear</u> with their ears, And <u>understand</u> with their heart, And return and be healed." (**Is.6:9-10**).



God refused to give His Word to those who despised it. So He gave it in parabolic language where the believer could understand.

"into captivity... killed with the sword" (Rv.13:10)



"captivity... killed"

- God has destined certain ones to <u>captivity</u> during the reign of the composite beast.
- The captivity will probably include <u>severe persecution</u>, but not necessarily death.
- Those so destined must seek no other route. It is God's perfect will.
- While some saints are destined for captivity, others are <u>destined</u> for martyrdom.
- Those God has destined to captivity, <u>PERSEVERANCE</u> will be realized.
- Those destined for physical death, <u>FAITH</u> will be realized.

Then I saw another beast coming up out of the earth, and he had two horns like a lamb and spoke like a dragon.

"beast... two horns like a lamb" (Rv.13:11)



"horns"

- This is the <u>only occasion</u> where John will <u>call this person</u> a beast.
- He will later be identified as "the false prophet".
- Lambs do not have horns, but rams do. So some believe it is best to see this as a ram with two horns.
- Horns symbolically represent power and authority.
- That he spoke like a dragon indicates he also spoke arrogantly with blasphemies.

And he exercises all the authority of the first beast in his presence, and causes the earth and those who dwell in it to worship the first beast, whose deadly wound was healed.

"he exercises all the authority of the first beast" (Rv.13:12)



"all the authority"

- The second beast operates, having been empowered and authorized by the first beast.
- This second beast makes the earth-dwellers to worship the first beast.
- He <u>clarifies</u> that the <u>first beast</u> is the one who had the <u>deadly wound</u> that was <u>healed</u>.

He performs great signs, so that he even makes fire come down from heaven on the earth in the sight of men.

"great signs... fire" (Rv.13:13)



"signs"

- "Signs" is plural indicating more than one sign is performed.
- How he is able to do these miracle is not indicated.
- The fire coming down from heaven seems to indicate the <u>limit</u> of the <u>beast's power</u>.

And he deceives those who dwell on the earth—by those signs which he was granted to do in the sight of the beast, telling those who dwell on the earth to make an image to the beast who was wounded by the sword and lived.

"signs which was granted... make an image" (Rv.13:14)



- The <u>first beast</u> authorized (<u>empowered</u>) the <u>second beast</u> with the ability to do great <u>miracles</u>.
- The result of the convincing miracles was for the earth dwellers to make an image to the first beast.
- The text does not tell us what the image will be.

"who was wounded by the sword and lived" (Rv.13:14)



"wounded by the sword"

- This is third time John refers to the identity of the beast referring to his deadly wound.
- This time he tells us the sword was the cause of the death of the beast.
- The sword is the instrument of death in capital punishment.

He was granted power to give breath to the image of the beast, that the image of the beast should both speak and cause as many as would not worship the image of the beast to be killed.

REVELATION 13:15

"granted power to give breath to the image" (Rv.13:15)



"breath to the image"

- Humans and angels certainly do not have the ability to give life to inanimate objects.
- This is likely some demonic deception.

"and cause as many as would not worship the image of the beast to be killed" (Rv.13:15)



"to be killed"

- The second beast causes as many as do not worship the image of the first beast to be killed.
- The order of execution is given by the second beast not the image itself.

16 He causes all, both small and great, rich and poor, free and slave, to receive a mark on their right hand or on their foreheads, ¹⁷ and that no one may buy or sell except one who has the mark or the name of the beast, or the number of his name.

"small... great... rich... poor... free... slave" (Rv.13:16)



"Small"

No segment of society will escape the notice of the beast.

"mark on their right hand or on their foreheads" (Rv.13:16)



"mark...hand... foreheads"

The place indicates the intent is for the mark to be easily seen.

"no one may buy or sell" (Rv.13:17)



"buy and sell"

- The purpose of the mark is at least economic.
- Economic sanctions will be a major issue during the persecution by the beast of the people of God.
- Starvation or worship of the beast will be the only alternatives for those who inhabit the earth.

Here is wisdom. Let him who has understanding calculate the number of the beast, for it is the number of a man: His number is 666.



"His number is 666" (Rv.13:18)



"666"

- This is the essential number of a man. The number six falls one short of God's perfect number, seven, and thus represents human imperfection.
- Antichrist, the most powerful human the world will ever know, will still be a man, i.e., a six.
- Identifying this particular mark is not as important as identifying the <u>purpose of the mark</u>.
- Those who accept it show their <u>allegiance to Satan</u>, and their willingness to operate within the <u>economic</u> system he promotes.



- Some kind of identification device to secure worship during the Great Tribulation (Rv.13:11-18).
- This mark is not simply a card people will carry, because it is placed in the <u>hand or forehead</u> (Rv.13:16).
- This end-times identification will be required by the Antichrist in order to buy and sell (Rv.13:17).
- This mark begins after the Beast starts his reign at the mid-point of the 70th Week of Daniel.
- The <u>False Prophet</u> is the one who causes people to take this mark.
- It will be difficult for the unbeliever to resist <u>Antichrist's</u> <u>claims</u> (2Th.2:9,11), and the <u>False Prophet's deceptions</u> (Rv.13:13).
- Taking the Mark seals their eternal destiny (Rv.14:9-13).


The number 666 identifies a person (Antichrist)


 That this number must be counted implies the physical or visual mark itself is not 666.
 This calls for wisdom (Rv.13:18)

SALVATION SECURITY

- A believer who is SEALED in union with Christ can not be lost.
- God will not allow a member of His family to take a mark that "reverses"
 HIS sovereign decision to save that person.
- Sometime prior to actually taking the mark, the weak and unprepared believer will be taken "home" by God through physical death.
- True believers will not want to take the mark.
