CREATION: SEVENTH DAY — GENESIS 2:1-3

The seventh day is unique as indicated by three verbs. The characteristics of that seventh day were designed by God to continue.



¹Thus the heavens and the earth, and all the host of them, were <u>finished</u>. ²And on the seventh day God ended His work which He had done, and He <u>rested</u> on the seventh day from all His work which He had done. ³Then God <u>blessed</u> the seventh day and sanctified it, because in it He rested from all His work which God had created and made. (**Ge.2:1-3**)

1. God "Finished" — Ge.2:1-2

- Heavens and earth "were finished" (v.1)
- "God ended His work which He had done" (v.2)
 - The whole work of Creation was finished. Thus, it was unique compared to days 1-6.
 - Creation was finished at the end of day six. This was 6, 24-hour days.
 - Since that time, there has been no other creation (exception of divine miracles).
 - It was complete. It lacked nothing so it was "very good" (Ge.1:31)

2. God "Rested" — Ge.2:2-3

- God "rested on the seventh day from all His work" (v.2)
- God "rested from all His work" (v.3)
 - Three times it tells us that His work was done (**Ge.2:1-3**)
 - This does not imply any kind of weariness (Is.40:28; Ps.121:4).
 - The result was that He was satisfied or "refreshed" (Ex.23:12).
 - God's delight would not end until sin came.
 - The conditions of that seventh day were designed by God to continue (no "evening and morning" component).

3. God "Blessed" — Ge.2:3

- God blessed the seventh day" (v.3)
 - God set it aside as a memorial, as a remembrance, that He created the universe.
 - Saturday is a perpetual witness that God finished creation.
 - To reject God as Creator in six days is to "unbless" the seventh day.
 - There is no mathematical or scientific reason for weeks. God established that order because of creation.
