Sin is **DEFILING**

1Ki.8:38; Zc.3:3; 11:8; Ti.1:15



- In 1 Kings 8:38, sin in man's heart is compared to ugly, oozing sores from a deadly plague.
- 1 "To the pure all things are pure, but to those who are defiled and unbelieving nothing is pure; but even their mind and conscience are defiled" (Ti.1:15)
- Even the divinely granted mechanism to cause them to do right is defiled. Even their warning system is broken.

Sin is **REBELLION**

Lv.26:27; Je.44:17



- Leviticus 26:27 says, "Walking contrary to God." Sin is walking in constant opposition to God
- Sin establishes a life of rebellion. Sin would not only unthrone God but ungod God, and replace Him with us.

Sin is **INGRATITUDE**

Lk.17:11-19; Ro.1:21



- "because, although they knew God, they did not glorify Him as God, nor were thankful, but became futile in their thoughts, and their foolish hearts were darkened." (Ro.1:21)
- It is like the nine lepers who were healed by Jesus and never came back to say thanks. Sin is ungrateful.

Sin is **HARD WORK**

Is.5:18; Je.9:4-5; Ps.7:14; Pr.4:16; Ja.1:15



- People work hard at sinning successfully. Sin will not let them stop. Sin is literally motivated to death.
- "Woe to those who draw iniquity with cords of vanity, And sin as if with a cart rope" (Is.5:18)
- They are like an ox hooked to a cart load of sin, and they drag it around everywhere.



Je.13:23; Ek.18:4; Ro.6:23



- 11 "For the wages of sin is death" (Ro.6:23)
- A man cannot do anything about his sin, because his heart is deceitful above all things.
- There is no way the sinner can expiate his sin even in Hell. That is why Hell lasts forever. It does not expiate his sin.
- Sin will kill him physically as it has killed him spititually, and it will ultimately kill him eternally.
