FEAST OF PURIM CELEBRATION

- Purim is celebrated annually on the 14th day of the Hebrew month of Adar.
- The Feast of Purim was not established by the Mosaic Law. It was commanded by Mordecai (Es.9:20-28) and by Esther (Es.9:29-32).
