2	<p>What about Sin and Evil?</p> <p>“How should man be just with God?” (Job 9:2)</p>	<p>The Death of Christ</p> <p>“Being justified freely by His grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus.” (Rom. 3:24)</p>
3	<p>The Question of Death and Immortality</p> <p>“If a man dies, will he live again?” (Job 14:14)</p>	<p>The Resurrection of Christ</p> <p>“Jesus said unto her, I am the resurrection, and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live.” (Jn.11:25)</p>

Man’s own inner being demands an answer to them.</p>	<p>The Economy of God</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • “And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose. Because those whom He foreknew, He also predestinated to be conformed to the image of His Son, that He might be the Firstborn among many brothers.” (Rom. 8:28-29) • “Therefore we do not lose heart; but though our outer man is decaying, yet our inner man is being renewed day by day. For our momentary lightness of affliction works out for us, more and more surpassingly, an eternal weight of glory.” (2 Cor. 4:16-17) • “...I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as refuse that I may gain Christ.” (Phil. 3:8)
