Types of Psalms	<b>Didactic</b> (inclined to teach)  <b>Imprecatory</b> (to invoke evil upon or curse)	<b>Historical</b> (looking back on God's dealings with Israel)  <b>Pilgrimage</b> (sung during pilgrimage to Jerusalem)	<b>Nature</b> (handiwork of God in creation)  <b>Hallelujah</b> (Praise God)	<b>Penitential</b> (expressing remorse for sin)  <b>Messianic</b> (Person and work of Jesus Christ)	<b>Thanksgiving</b> (celebration and praise to God for his wondrous blessings)  <b>Supplication</b> (to make a humble entreaty)
