

7 RHETORICAL QUESTIONS — AMOS 3:3-6

- 1 Can Two Walk Together, Unless They Are Agreed? (v.3)**
 - Two do not walk together along a road unless they have first met, chatted, and agreed to continue on together.
- 2 Will a Lion Roar in the Forest, When He Has No Prey? (v.4)**
 - A lion does not roar in the thicket unless he has spotted his prey and begun his fearful charge.
- 3 Will a Young Lion Cry Out of His Den, If He Has Caught Nothing? (v.4)**
 - A lion's contented growl in his den is a sure sign that something has been caught.
- 4 Will a Bird Fall Into a Snare on the Earth, Where There Is No Trap For It? (v.5)**
 - A bird does not fall into a trap unless a snare has first been baited and set.
- 5 Will a Snare Spring up From the Earth, If It Has Caught Nothing At All? (v.5)**
 - Does a trap spring up from the earth unless something catchable has triggered it.
- 6 If a Trumpet is Blown in a City, Will Not the People Be Afraid? (v.6)**
 - People do not tremble unless a war trumpet has been sounded in a city.
- 7 If There is Calamity in a City, Will Not The LORD Have Done It? (v.6)**
 - A disaster does not come to a city unless the Lord has determined to cause it.
