Mt.24:36, "But of that day and hour no one knows"


Mt.24:42, "for you do not know what hour your Lord is coming"

JUDGMENT OF THE GENTILES

Mt.25:31-46

- Evaluation of Gentiles living through 70th Week For Treatment of Israel or "My brethren" (Mt.25:40; Jl.3:2; 3:12)
- Involves all surviving people—probably through use of angels
- Described as mingled sheep and goats—The Lord separates them (v.32-33)
- Judged individually, not as national groups—nations not thrown into fire
- Takes place during the 45 days preceding the Millennial Kingdom (Da.12:12)
- Those saved (sheep) will enter the 1000-Year Kingdom (Zc.14:16; Is.19:18-22)
- Those unsaved (goats) will go to "torments" in hades awaiting GWT
- Believers will be returned to their respective nations where they will serve God (Zc.14:16)

All the nations will be gathered before Him, and He will separate them one from another, as a shepherd divides his sheep from the goats.

And He will set the sheep on His right hand, but the goats on the left.

Then the King will say to those on His right hand, 'Come, you blessed of My Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world: Matthew 25:34

THE RIGHTEOUS

Mt.25:34-40

- Those who gave aid to the servants of Jesus (after the rapture during the DOTL)
- The "My brethren" (v.40) are probably the 144,000 (Re.7:1-8)
- Aiding the "brethren" is pictured as doing it or believing on Jesus (Jn.15:18-21)
- The aid given is EVIDENCE of salvation not the BASIS
- That they help the "brethren" indicates they likely accepted their message
- These believers lived outside the direct jurisdiction of the beast

for I was hungry and you gave Me food; I was thirsty and you gave Me drink; I was a stranger and you took Me in;

I was naked and you clothed Me; I was sick and you visited Met I was in prison and you came to Me.'

"Then the righteous will answer Him, saying, 'Lord, when did we see You hungry and feed You, or thirsty and give You drink?

When did we see You a stranger and take You in, or naked and clothe You?

Or when did we see You sick, or in prison, and come to You?'

And the King will answer and say to them, 'Assuredly, I say to you, inasmuch as you did it to one of the least of these My brethren, you did it to Me.'

"Then He will also say to those on the left hand, 'Depart from Me, you cursed, into the everlasting fire prepared for the devil and his angels: Matthew 25:41

THE UNRICHTEOUS

Mt.25:41-46

- These did not aid the "brethren"
- Their failure indicates they rejected the gospel, and thus God and His people
- They are condemned NOT for not helping, but for not believing
- Immediate indictment on them NOT the ultimate destiny
- Hades comes first (Luke 16:23-24, 28), then Lake of Fire (Re.20:12-15)

for I was hungry and you gave Me no food; I was thirsty and you gave Me no drink;

I was a stranger and you did not take Me in, naked and you did not clothe Me, sick and in prison and you did not visit Me.'

"Then they also will answer Him, saying, 'Lord, when did we see You hungry or thirsty or a stranger or maked or sick or in prison, and did not minister to You?' Matthew 25:44

Then He will answer them, saying, 'Assuredly, I say to you, inasmuch as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to Me.

And these will go away into everlasting punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

BRETHREN OR NEIGHBOR

Treatment of "My brethren" (Mt.25:40)
Who Is My Neighbor?" (Lk.10:29)

- Rejection of the King as seen in people's reception or rejection of the King's brothers
 - Jesus is treating the brothers as one would treat Him.
 - To reject the brothers, is to reject Jesus.
