**Psalm 2; 110; Revelation 11:15, 18**

**<sup>1</sup>Why do the nations rage, And the people plot a vain thing? <sup>2</sup>The kings of the earth set themselves, And the rulers take counsel together, Against the LORD and against His Anointed, saying, <sup>3</sup>"Let us break Their bonds in pieces And cast away Their cords from us." <sup>4</sup>He who sits in the heavens shall laugh; The LORD shall hold them in derision. <sup>5</sup>Then He shall speak to them in His wrath, And distress them in His deep displeasure: <sup>6</sup>"Yet I have set My King On My holy hill of Zion." <sup>7</sup>"I will declare the decree: The LORD has said to Me, 'You are My Son, Today I have begotten You. <sup>8</sup>Ask of Me, and I will give You The nations for Your inheritance, And the ends of the earth for Your possession. <sup>9</sup>You shall break them with a rod of iron; You shall dash them to pieces like a potter's vessel.' " <sup>10</sup>Now therefore, be wise, O kings; Be instructed, you judges of the earth. <sup>11</sup>Serve the LORD with fear, And rejoice with trembling. <sup>12</sup>Kiss the Son, lest He be angry, And you perish in the way, When His wrath is kindled but a little. Blessed are all those who put their trust in Him. (Ps.2:1-12)**

**Reign of the Lord's Anointed —**

**PSALM 2**

**<sup>1</sup>A Psalm of David. The LORD said to my Lord,"Sit at My right hand,  
Till I make Your enemies Your footstool." <sup>2</sup>The LORD shall send the  
rod of Your strength out of Zion. Rule in the midst of Your enemies!**

**<sup>3</sup>Your people shall be volunteers In the day of Your power; In the  
beauties of holiness, from the womb of the morning, You have the  
dew of Your youth. <sup>4</sup>The LORD has sworn And will not relent, "You  
are a priest forever According to the order of Melchizedek." <sup>5</sup>The  
Lord is at Your right hand; He shall execute kings in the day of His  
wrath. <sup>6</sup>He shall judge among the nations, He shall fill the places  
with dead bodies, He shall execute the heads of many countries.**

**<sup>7</sup>He shall drink of the brook by the wayside; Therefore He shall  
lift up the head. (Ps.110:1-7)**

# JESUS ANNOUNCES HIS KINGDOM

(Ps.2:1-12; 110:1-7; Rv.11:15-19)

End of Daniel's 70th Week at the sounding of the 7th trumpet (Da.9:24-27; 12:11-12; Rv.11:2-15)

Jesus announces His Kingdom (Rv.11:15), "Then the seventh angel sounded: And there were loud voices in heaven, saying, 'The kingdoms of this world have become the kingdoms of our Lord and of His Christ, and He shall reign forever and ever!'" (Compare Re.14:1 where Jesus is standing on the earth, specifically on Mount Zion).

After Jesus' pronouncement of the kingdom, "the nations were enraged" (Rv.11:18; Ps.2:1-12; 110:1-7)

Why would they come to Armageddon? Jesus recently announced His kingdom in Jerusalem (Rv.11:15). They came to do battle with Christ (Rv.16:12-16; 19:19).

6th Trumpet initiates the campaign of Armageddon (Rv.9:13-21). The 6th Bowl judgment, where the Euphrates dries up, expands the campaign of armies that gather to Armageddon (Rv.16:12-16; 19:11-21).

Imagine the amount of time it will take to assemble so many people and armies to this place.

Jerusalem divided into 3 parts. Men blaspheme God (Rv.16:17-21)
