Passages that interchangeably use the terms *parousia* and the *day of the Lord*

CONNECTED

“COMING”

parousia

The Parousia generally expresses a positive and redemptive aspect of the Lord's Coming.

**“DAY OF
THE LORD”**

The Day of the Lord generally expresses a negative and judgmental aspect of the Lord's return.

DOTL & PAROUSIA CONNECTION

Passages that interchangeably use the terms *parousia* and the *day of the Lord*

1. BLAMELESS (*Parousia*)

- “that you may approve the things that are excellent, that you may be sincere and **without offense** till the **day of Christ**” (Ph.1:10)
- “who will also confirm you to the end, that you **may be blameless** in the **day of our Lord Jesus Christ**” (1Co.1:8)
- “so that He may **establish your hearts blameless** in holiness before our God and Father at the **coming** of our Lord Jesus Christ with all His saints.” (1Th.3:13)
- “Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you completely; and may your whole spirit, soul, and body be preserved **blameless** at the **coming** of our Lord Jesus Christ.” (1Th.5:23)

CONNECTED

DAY OF THE LORD (*Day of Christ*)

3. DESTRUCTION (*Parousia*)

- “¹⁰But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night ... ¹²looking for and hastening the **coming** of the day of God” (2Pe.3:10-12)

CONNECTED

2. SALVATION (*Parousia*)

- “deliver such a one to Satan for the destruction of the flesh, that his spirit may be **saved** in the **day of the Lord Jesus**.” (1Co.5:5)
- “being confident of this very thing, that He who has begun a good work in you will complete it until the **day of Jesus Christ**” (Ph.1:6)
- “But each one in his own order: Christ the firstfruits, afterward those who are Christ's at His **coming**.” (1Co.15:23)

DOTL & PAROUSIA CONNECTION

Passages that interchangeably use the terms *parousia* and the *day of the Lord*

1. REJOICING (*Parousia*)

- “(as also you have understood us in part), that we are your **boast** as you also are ours, in the **day of the Lord Jesus.**” (2Co.1:14)
- “holding fast the word of life, so that I may **rejoice** in the **day of Christ** that I have not run in vain or labored in vain.” (Ph.2:16)
- “For what is our hope, or joy, or crown of **rejoicing**? Is it not even you in the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ at His **coming**?” (1Th.2:19)

CONNECTED

DAY OF THE LORD (*Day of Christ*)

3. JUDGMENT (*Parousia*)

- “⁸You also be patient. Establish your hearts, for the **coming** of the Lord is at hand. ⁹Do not grumble against one another, brethren, lest you be condemned. **Behold, the Judge** is standing at the door!” (Ja.5:8-9)
- “and did not know until the **flood came** and took them all away, so also will the **coming** of the Son of Man be.” (Mt.24:39)

CONNECTED

2. RAPTURE (*Parousia*)

- “⁴⁻¹⁵For this we say to you by the word of the Lord, that we who are alive and remain until the **coming** of the Lord will by no means precede those who are asleep. ⁵⁻²For you yourselves know perfectly that the **day of the Lord** so comes as a **thief in the night.**” (1Th.4:15-5:2)
- “But as the **days of Noah** were, so also will the **coming** of the Son of Man be.” (Mt.24:37)
- “And then the lawless one will be revealed, whom the **Lord will consume** with the breath of His mouth and destroy with the brightness of His **coming.**” (2Th.2:8)
