THE LORD'S SUPPER DIMENSIONS

PAST

It is a Memorial (Looking Back at the Cross)



- 1. Paul describes the account as given by the Lord Himself (1Co.11:23-25)
- Paul was not present at the Lord's Supper. Paul received instruction directly from Jesus (Ga.1:11-17).
- 2. We eat the bread in memory of the violent death of Christ upon His body (1Co.11:24)
- The death of Christ was not a tragedy but a triumph. For the New Covenant to be inaugurated Christ had to die (**He.9:16**). This was God's plan.
- 3. We drink the fruit of the vine in memory of the blood Jesus shed (1Co.11:25)

PRESENT

It is a Communion

(Looking Around in Unity)



- 1. Right now we are <u>sharing</u> in the reality of Christ's broken body on our behalf (1Co.11:16b-17)
- Paul enlarges on the meaning of the bread. We are one in fellowship with the body of Christ and one in fellowship with the Church (1Co.10:16-17, "one bread and one body"). This is why our fellowship with one another is so important.

It is an Introspection (Looking Inside

(Looking Inside Your Heart)



- 1. Right now we are <u>sharing</u> in the reality of Christ's spilt blood on our behalf (1Co.11:16a)
- 2. Right now we should <u>examine</u> ourselves before taking communion (1Co.11:27-30)

FUTURE

It is a Proclamation

(Looking Forward to Christ's Return)



- 1. Right now we are proclaiming our faith that our sins are forgiven (1Co.11:26a)
- 2. Right now we are proclaiming our faith in our Lord's Return (1Co.11:26b)
- We are to do this "Till He come" (if He is not coming why observe or proclaim it?)
